1 **A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY REGARDING THE**
2 **MAYOR'S PROCLAMATION OF EMERGENCY (COVID-19) AND THE MAYOR'S**
3 **AND ACTING MAYOR'S ORDERS AND REGULATIONS ISSUED**
4 **THEREUNDER.**

7 **WHEREAS**, the Mayor issued a Proclamation of Emergency (COVID-19) on
8 March 12, 2020 and since then the Mayor and Acting Mayor have both issued
9 emergency orders and regulations to address it; and

11 **WHEREAS**, the Assembly may terminate the Proclamation of Emergency under
12 Anchorage Municipal Code section 3.80.080, and may terminate individual orders
13 or regulations that the Assembly deems are no longer necessary under AMC section
14 3.80.085; and

16 **WHEREAS**, having considered the impact of the emergency orders and regulations
17 on the public health and the Anchorage economy, and the data related to the spread
18 of COVID-19, the capability of health care services in Anchorage to handle
19 anticipated cases, the increased ability to test, and the increased contact tracing
20 capacity, the Assembly finds it appropriate to review the necessity of the Mayor's
21 proclamation, and Mayor's and Acting Mayor's orders, and regulations; now,

24 **THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY RESOLVES:**
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26 **Section 1.** The Assembly extended the Proclamation of Emergency (COVID-19)
27 to January 15, 2021 per AR 2020-398(S), As Amended. The Assembly changes
28 that, if a box is checked below, so the Proclamation of Emergency is hereby

34 hereby terminated:
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- 36 EO-04-V3 Temporarily Lifting Enforcement of Bag Fees Ordinance.

39 and Regulations with State Law.
40 1. The Municipality shall not enforce any Municipal Code or
41 regulation that prohibits curbside pickup of alcohol from
42 restaurants, breweries, distilleries, and retail stores, as well as
43 the delivery of sealed beer and wine from restaurants with food

orders.

- 2. The Municipality shall not enforce any Municipal Code or regulation that prohibits internet or phone sales, or exterior window or curbside pick-up of marijuana or marijuana products.

- EO-13-v3 Requirement for Masks or Cloth Faced Coverings.
