Submitted by: Chair of the Assembly at the Request of the Acting Mayor Prepared by: Dept. of Law For reading: April 13, 2021 ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AR No. 2021-110 A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY FOR AN EIGHTH 1 EXTENSION OF THE DECLARATION OF CIVIL EMERGENCY (COVID-19) 2 **ISSUED BY THE MAYOR OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE ON MARCH** 3 4 12, 2020. 5 WHEREAS, a novel coronavirus or COVID-19, a respiratory disease that can result 6 in serious illness or death, is caused by the SARS-CoV-2 virus, which is a new strain 7 of coronavirus that had not been previously identified in humans and can easily 8 spread from person to person; and 9 10 WHEREAS, pursuant to the Proclamation of Emergency (COVID-19), on March 12, 11 2020, the Mayor made the following provisions: 12 13 THE FOLLOWING EMERGENCY REGULATIONS TO BE 14 EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY TO PRESERVE PUBLIC SAFETY AND 15 WELFARE WITHIN AND ADJACENT TO THE MUNICIPALITY. 16 THE FOLLOWING EMERGENCY REGULATIONS HAVE THE 17 POWER OF LAW, SHALL REMAIN IN EFFECT FOR THE 18 DURATION OF THIS EMERGENCY, AND SHALL SUPERSEDE 19 ALL CONFLICTING LAWS DURING THE EXISTENCE OF THIS 20 EMERGENCY. 21 22 1. The Municipality is authorized to request assistance from the State 23 of Alaska for fire protection, law enforcement, and the provision of 24 any other funds, services, functions, supplies or materials 25 determined by the Mayor, in consultation with the Office of 26 Emergency Management, to be necessary to meet public safety and 27 welfare needs arising from or incidental to COVID-19 and to recover 28 from the damages caused. 29 30 2. The Mayor may implement any orders necessary to prevent the 31 transmission of infectious disease and to ensure that all cases of 32 contagious disease are subject to proper control and treatment. 33 34 3. The requirements of Chapters 7.15 and 7.20 of the Anchorage 35 Municipal Code (AMC) are hereby suspended for the duration of this 36 emergency, except for the requirements set forth in AMC 7.20.090, 37 for the acquisition of supplies, equipment, services, personnel, fuel 38 or food as may be necessary to implement the Comprehensive 39 Emergency Operations Plan or otherwise to preserve and protect the 40 public safety, health and welfare from COVID-19 and from the effects 41 thereof. 42

1 2 4. All resources of the municipal government, including municipal personnel, are hereby available as necessary to cope with this 3 emergency. Municipal departments, agencies, or personnel may be 4 transferred or altered in function for the purpose of performing or 5 facilitating performance services responsive to this emergency.; 6 7 8 and 9 **WHEREAS**, the Assembly has extended the Declaration of Emergency seven 10 times, most recently on January 12, 2021 (AR No. 2021-10) until April 16, 2021 at 11 eleven fifty-nine (11:59) p.m.; and 12 13 14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35 36 37 38 39 40 41 42 43 44 45 46 47 48

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WHEREAS, the vaccine is still unavailable to a large portion of our population -50

WHEREAS, as of April 9, 2021, the United States has experienced more than 31 million confirmed cases of COVID-19 and over 560,000 deaths from the virus; and

WHEREAS, as of April 9, 2021, the State of Alaska has experienced 64,531 total confirmed cases of COVID-19, and the virus is responsible for the deaths of 309 Alaskans; and

WHEREAS, as of April 9, 2021, the Municipality of Anchorage has experienced 28,508 confirmed cases and 164 deaths among residents; and

WHEREAS, the virus is still present and spreading in Anchorage, with a recent 14day rolling average of new cases of 24.25 per 100,000 population, which is well above the 10 per 100,000 threshold for being in the "high alert" zone under State guidelines; and

WHEREAS, while case counts are below this winter's peak, Anchorage has recently experienced an increase in its average daily case counts and has seen the arrival of new variants which stand to pose even greater risks; and

WHEREAS, lifting our emergency response would result in larger loss of life; and

WHEREAS, extending our emergency response allows the Municipality to respond nimbly to an ever-changing public health emergency with emergency orders, which have proven effective at limiting the spread of COVID-19 cases; and

WHEREAS, vaccine distribution is underway in Anchorage, but requires extraordinary municipal effort; and

**WHEREAS**, emergency powers that ease Anchorage's contracting requirements and allow reassignment of staff are critical to Anchorage's efforts to distribute the vaccine efficiently and equitably; and

WHEREAS, although a vaccine is widely available in Anchorage, most Anchorage residents remain unvaccinated and thus Anchorage remains susceptible to surges in infection that could overwhelm the hospital system if not swiftly contained; and

children – and emergency powers enable Anchorage to limit the spread of COVID-19 to this vulnerable population; and

**WHEREAS**, the full potential extent and long-term effects of COVID-19 cannot yet be known, it nonetheless remains vital to be prepared and take all needed precautions throughout the entire timeframe of the emergency to allow the MOA to be able to rapidly address any public health emergency related to COVID-19 as it arises; and

WHEREAS, these circumstances make it necessary for the Mayor's proclamation
of emergency to remain activated and in place to address the ongoing public health,
safety and welfare issues resulting from this emergency beyond its current April 16,
2021 termination date; and

**WHEREAS,** individual emergency orders issued by the Mayor have previously had and may continue to have dates shorter than the length of the full emergency proclamation,

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to AMC section 3.80.080, the Assembly may terminate the emergency proclamation at any time, and pursuant to AMC section 3.80.085 may alternatively terminate specific emergency orders or emergency regulations,

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to AMC section 3.80.080, the Assembly now deems it necessary to extend the terms of the Proclamation of Emergency at this time through July 16, 2021 at eleven fifty-nine (11:59) p.m. to protect the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Municipality; now, therefore,

## THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY RESOLVES:

**Section 1.** The Municipality of Anchorage Proclamation of Emergency (COVID-19) issued March 12, 2020 is hereby extended through July 16, 2021 at eleven fiftynine (11:59) p.m. The Administration shall submit not less than weekly regular reports to the Assembly on any emergency measures taken under the Proclamation of Emergency (COVID-10) as this health emergency evolves.

**Section 2.** The Mayor shall, if an additional extension of the Proclamation of Emergency (COVID-19) is requested beyond the date approved in this Resolution, submit to the Assembly a written report detailing reasons the additional extension is requested and the impact on the emergency brought about by existing and previous emergency orders.

**Section 3.** This resolution shall be effective immediately upon passage and approval by the Assembly.

**Section 4.** Any further extension of the emergency order shall be subject to a public hearing to occur at least three days before the expiration of the declaration of emergency.
